Carl is just finishing up his first year on our CCC Board. “I was asked to join the board to represent a newer curler’s perspective of the club and I hope I do that,” he says.

I hope that members are seeing the benefits already, but we are really only just beginning to work together between the committees. So I guess my goal is simply to help the club grow and bring more curling to the Valley of the Sun!”

Carl doesn’t spend all of his time at the curling club, of course. For the last 10 weeks, he has been almost entirely focused on raising a Chocolate Lab puppy! Tip: hide your curling shoes, Carl, hide your shoes.

This week's clubmate is Craig Burton!

You know how at the end of this feature we ask you to nominate a member you'd like to learn more about? Well, we got a nominee, folks. **Carl Thompson**, featured last week, nominated this week's member, **Craig Burton**. Well, this should be fun.



Craig is a relatively new member of CCC but he's not new to the sport, having started out as a teen back when he lived in Sarnia, Ontario. He quickly became a "rink rat," spending hours after school at the club throwing rocks and hanging out with friends. (editor's note – accurate description of many Canadians' misspent youth).

Craig's family moved to Thornhill, Ontario, when he was in high school and he kept involved with curling there, following his dad's footsteps into the world of competitive curling.

Craig has played in many competitive events but the one he is most proud of was his win of the Ontario Colts in 2005. He played second on the team, which was skipped by Rob Shepherd. During that competition, Rob was battling a brain tumor, a battle he ultimately lost. "Winning that banner, with and for Rob, will always be one of the best and most important achievements of my curling life," says Craig.

Some may argue that another one of those important curling achievements was crossing paths with future (amazing, awesome, he is SO lucky) wife, Jayne.

"Jayne was curling mixed with a friend of mine, who broke his arm tobogganing. He asked me to spare to finish out the season. The next year, the second of that team left to join another club, so I joined the team full-time," he says. The rest, as they say, is history.

Craig moved to Arizona from Ontario in 2010, due to a job transfer with his employer, American Express. At the time, his two kids were too young to hang around behind the glass like they do now, so everyone took a break from curling. The break lasted five years. Then one night, with the kids signed up to a parents-night-out event, Craig and Jayne took a drive from North Scottsdale all the way out to Tempe to take a few slides.

"We showed up at about 6:00 that Friday and threw a lot of rocks, it felt great. They needed a couple of players for a Friday night game, so we joined in," he says. "Everyone was really welcoming."

"We have a lot of visitors from different parts of Canada come stay with us through the winter," Craig says. "One of our favorite things to do is bring them to the curling club. Every single one of them has been so impressed with the quality of curling and the volunteer spirit of this club. It really is a model other clubs should be paying attention to."

These days, three members of the family are members of CCC with 12-year old Liam taking interest in the sport. Three down, one to go.

## Clubmates Corner

### This week’s clubmate is Rebecca Clark!

You can travel far and you can travel wide and you will still be hard pressed to find a curler as committed and excited by all things curling as this week’s feature member! In her short time being involved with the sport, Rebecca has put in countless hours curling, attending clinics, watching curling online, talking curling on Twitter, and attending several international events. She is a Certified Level 1 Instructor, Certified Level 1 Official and a Certified Wheelchair Instructor, and is signed up to take the Level 2 Instructors course.



The high activity of CCC has helped fuel her fire. “We have hosted MOPAC Playdowns, USA Mixed Nationals, USA Wheelchair High Performance Camps, and the Ed Werenich Golden Wrench Classic. All of these experiences, plus leagues and spiels, have shown me a lot of ways to play eight stones. I didn’t even have to get on an airplane,” she says.

Still, Rebecca’s passion and love of the game has inspired several trips afar.

At the 2016 USA Nationals in Jacksonville, WA, she attended the WCF Coach Mentor Program. The seminars focused on techniques, soft skills, ice conditions, officiating and benchmark analysis. “I returned from Jacksonville with an entire new way to see the game,” she says.

At the 2017 USA Nationals in Everett, WA, she worked with CurlingZone.com’s Gerry Guerts doing statistics throughout the week. “It showed me that it’s not the player that is shooting 100%, it’s the team that has 100% accuracy at that position. I applied those skills when I did the commentary of this year’s Desert Ice Bonspiel.” (find it at the Coyotes Curling YouTube channel!)

“My most recent experience in Calgary and Lethbridge, AB, was totally a curling fan’s dream,” she says. “Being at the GSOC Champions Cup was a lot of fun. I got to meet my favorite team and people I had been conversing with on Twitter. I participated in the Sandra Schmirler sweep. I spoke to ice crew about unique GSOC related challenges. I even got in some laughs with the people in the booth.”

Rebecca is a tireless supporter of CCC and #CurlingInTheDesert on her Twitter feed @frontendcurler. She has been able to spread the word about our dedicated ice to other curling fans, elite curlers, and their coaches.

She also uses Twitter to message with other players directly, asking questions. Tips she’s taken away include the importance of team communication, positive attitude, athleticism, mental toughness and commitment.

“The curlers on TV are people, just like us. They have jobs, families, and responsibilities outside of curling. They are perfectionists and take great efforts to achieve near perfection. To be the best, there are a lot of unspoken sacrifices. Those sacrifices are made by the families, employers, and friends just as much as the players themselves.”

“I enjoy coaching because I am an outside person looking in. I have only been curling for three years and I may not make all my shots, but I have experiences, resources, and training, all focused on coaching.”

Rebecca’s analytical side serves her well in her career as a software engineer, and she’s hoping to continue to use what she’s learned to support her fellow Coyotes. “Coyotes support each other and this is something I can do for others.”

### This week’s clubmate is Tracy Heuermann

We are pleased to feature one of our Board Members, a dedicated player, curling coach extraordinaire and the lady with the infectious smile – Tracy Heuermann!



Tracy is a proud Kansas Jayhawk, born and raised in rural Kansas. She graduated from the University of Kansas with degrees in Psychology and Education. She moved to Scottsdale in 1985 bringing along her love of tennis, golf, and her sense of adventure. She spent those years as a full-time Mom of three terrific kids, squeezing in time to volunteer.

And then along came curling. “Ten years ago I took my first Learn to Curl with the Coyotes Curling Club, and I was hooked instantly,” she says. She and her youngest daughter, Jamie, decided to join a league. At that time, Jamie, a freshman in high school, was the youngest member of the club.

Jamie eventually stopped curling as she became immersed in college life, but Tracy was here to stay. “I joined this club because I fell in love with the game, but I stayed because I love the people! I think we are known for our warmth and hospitality, and that is the message that I share everywhere I travel.”

And travel she has. Over the years, Tracy has played in numerous bonspiels, competed in several MOPAC events, gone to the PIC in Vancouver a couple of times, and played at the US Women’s Nationals. The most memorable of which was a few years ago, skipping a team and playing with her daughter.

Tracy puts a lot of her heart into this sport of ours. “My favorite way to give back to this club is in teaching Learn to Curl events, both public and corporate, and serving on the Board.”

“I have recently begun a bit of grant writing,” she adds, indicating that this endeavor is rewarding in more ways than one. “If my work results in the club being awarded funds, that will feel better to me than any event in which I might compete.”

When she’s not curling (or teaching curling) Tracy gives time and energy to causes that are meaningful to her. Each week she volunteers at Ability360, a facility which specializes in equipment for all types of disabilities, and emphasizes inclusive, adaptive sports. Her work there prompted her to get her Wheelchair Curling Certification in addition to Level 1 certification. Over the years she has also given her time to Back-to-School Clothing Drives, Special Olympics, the Area Agency on Aging, Food Banks, and Habitat for Humanity.

She even finds ways to combine her love for travel with her love for helping. “In July, I’m heading to Madrid, Spain to volunteer with an organization called Diverbo, which invites native English speakers to come talk for 12 hours a day with Europeans who have a desire to improve their conversational English. I’m excited about the opportunity to meet some interesting people and will cap off my trip with eight days in Portugal.”

She’s continually expanding her horizons, continually on the move, and she admits she ALWAYS has the next “bucket-list” item in her head.

“I’ve recently been to Alaska to watch the start of the Iditarod, rafted the tidal bore in the Bay of Fundy, hiked the Inca Trail to Machu Picchu, and hiked in the Outback of Australia. Next up is curling in Scotland and beer-drinking in Belgium. After that I’m planning to white-water raft the Futaleufu River in Chile, and hike in Patagonia. I’m never bored, and I’m always happy to come home...but just for a little while!”
